## TWOB Provides Management Training to THS Academy Students

One of The Way of Business's (TWOB) roles over the past nine years has been to support organizations and individuals with training that is aimed to promote their success. Most recently TWOB has been asked to provide formal education to seminary students in the subject area of organizational management.

The THS Academy is an international seminary, based out of Germany, and has 5 locations, one being right here in Spokane, Washington.

THS Academy provides a three year certified program for people desiring to achieve a pastoral role in leading and supporting Christ's church throughout the world. One of the most powerful aspects within the curriculum of THS is educating their students in how to manage organizations. Carl Tompkins, president of TWOB, was approached by THS on how to

deliver such education, and he responded by delivering a curriculum that met this requirement. Tompkins stated that one of the most prevalent causes of problems within the church is poor execution of the required business practices in managing the organization. When it comes to money and people, much of the same required management skills apply to all organizations whether they be secular or spiritual by nature.

In February of this year, Tompkins delivered to THS students the eight modules of organizational management curriculum, who attend his training sessions on-line. He stated that this was a new experience for him, as he was not in front of a live classroom setting. He added that it was most interesting in working within a virtual classroom setting that was made up of participants from Europe, Africa, India and the United States.

Most surprising is how this multi-cultural group blended so well and each gained a common and applicable set of instructions on how to prevent problems between people within an organization. Tompkins reported that the key learning points of each module apply within any culture and organization, making this section of education very well accepted.

The subjects covered within the organization management curriculum were The Essentials of Vision and Mission Statements and Code of Values, Attaining Goals through Effective Activity Management, SWOT Analysis, the Absolutes of Time Management, Achieving Partnership for Life, Managing People through REME, What Causes People to Tick and Stick, Living up to the Five Words of Worth, and how to Gain and Maintain Financial Support.

often, an absent father. Strong Fathers is committed to reaching out to these men providing a holistic approach to bringing families together and giving those men the opportunity and the tools needed to be a father and raise their children.

Fatherlessness is epidemic in our nation. According to the US Census Bureau, one in three children live without their biological father at home. The truth is that there exists a 'father factor' in nearly all the societal issues facing America today. Research shows when a child grows up in a home absent a father, he or she is more likely to go to prison, more likely to commit a crime, more likely to abuse drugs and alcohol, two times more likely to drop out of high school, four times more likely to live in poverty.

Strong Fathers is a front-line ministry, addressing needs that cross all socio-economic, religious, and political boundaries.
